Background of Issue:				
Section 375.30.30 of Am. Sub. H.B. 119 of the 127th General Assembly prohibits boards of trustees from authorizing waivers or nonpayment of instructional fees or general fees for any particular student or any class of students, other than waivers specifically authorized by law or approved by the Chancellor. <u>Directive 2009-011</u> established guidelines for a board of trustees of a state institution of higher education in Ohio to adopt a flexible tuition policy and submit requests.

		This action would help to ensure that the broadest range of eligible students would have access to CCP courses, regardless of whether or not they are public school students. This action would allow all students the same chance at being successful by ensuring that cost is not a burden.		
		During the 2021-2022 CCP year, the College waived tuition for home-schooled and private school students on a total of 1,066 credit hours. If these hours had been billed at the regular tuition rate, the revenue generated would have been approximately \$170,000. Under the tuition waiver approved by the Board of Trustees in 2021, these hours generated a revenue of approximately \$46,000. However, it is likely that if the College does not provide this waiver, it will lose a large portion of these students and their registered hours.		
Recommendation: Approve the policy as presented.
