Instructions:

High school seniors who live in Darke County and attend a Darke County high school or are home-schooled may submit this application by **April 1, 2017**. One application allows you to be considered for all categories of high school scholarships. Awards are based on the following criteria (not necessarily in this order): grade point average, ACT score, activities, essay and financial need. Financial need is not a factor for some scholarships.

The Darke County Foundation uses a reimbursement method of awarding scholarships. Potential recipients will be announced at the high school graduation or awards program. Scholarship money will be disbursed following the student's first semester (or quarter) in college, providing the student earns at least a 2.75 grade point average in that grading period. Students are required to submit their first semester (or quarter) college transcript to the Darke County Foundation by Jan. 6, 2018. The Foundation will issue a check to the student upon receipt of satisfactory transcript.
