Course Rationale

Quantitative Reasoning can be defined as the application of mathematic skills to analyze and interpret real-world quantitative information in the context of a discipline to draw conclusions that are relevant to students in their daily lives.

Course Objectives

The students will

1. Engage in a meaningful intellectual experience.
2. Increase quantitative and logical reasoning abilities.
3. Improve ability to communicate quantitative and mathematical ideas.
4. Strengthen mathematical abilities that are necessary in other disciplines.

Communication

This is an online course, therefore, reading the Announcements section of Blackboard weekly is required. This is how you and I remain on the same page.

The easiest and best way to communicate with me is through email. My email is listed on the first page of the syllabus, feel free to contact me at any time. I check my email frequently, however, please allow 24 hours as a maximum length of time for me to respond to you during the week and 48 hours on the weekend. All students **MUST** use their Edison email accounts when corresponding regarding this course. **Since this is an online course, it is imperative that you check your Edison email every day.** Your Edison State Outlook email is embedded within your free Microsoft Office 365 account. You can access this by going to Edison State's homepage, click on Current Students, and then Office 365. Put your email account on your phone! This is the main way I contact you.

Calculator (Required)

A scientific calculator of any brand is recommended for this course. A graphing calculator is optional for this course--preferably a TI-83/84 model. Calculators capable of symbolic manipulation (e.g., TI-89, TI-Nspire, TI Voyage 200, HP-48, HP-50) are prohibited. The instructor may restrict calculator use on any assignment or exam.

Classroom Courtesy

Conduct yourself in a manner that is conducive to learning. Be kind, respectful, and professional in your communication with me. If you behave inappropriately, you will be removed from the class.

Expectations Outside of Class

Because this is a 3-credit hour, 16-week course, you can expect to spend 9-12 hours per week on videos, assignments, homework, exams, asking questions, and studying. The pace of this course moves very quickly and waiting until the last

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minute can be detrimental to your assignments and grades, due to questions you may have or technology issues. Starting your assignments on the day they are due means you are already behind. If this time requirement is not conducive to your lifestyle, I recommend you drop the course. If you are having trouble learning the content of this course online, I recommend you drop this course and register for it in person.

Attendance/Participation

Turning in your work on time is crucial to being successful in this course. Your *two* lowest book activity grades and your *two* lowest homework grades are automatically dropped from your final weighted average as they are entered into Blackboard. No exam grades will be dropped. I do not allow late or make-up homework or make-up exams, as it is not fair for the rest of the class who prepared for and turned their assignments in on time. You have access to all the due dates for all the assignments on the first day of class, so work ahead and plan accordingly. Procrastination is not your friend, so start your assignments early. If you begin your assignments the day they are due, you are behind.

Notes

You are expected to take clear and meaningful notes over every section covered in class. They will assist you in completing other assignments required for this class.

Weekly Book Activities

Book Activities must be completed and submitted prior to the due date and time. You will be required to SCAN or take a PHOTO of your assignments written in your book and UPLOAD them in the properly labeled assignment sections of our Blackboard course. By registering for any online course, you proved competency in the ability to submit assignments via Blackboard. Weekly Homework

Register for and complete your online homework assignments through the ALEKS link in our Blackboard course site, which will redirect you to the ALEKS site. You do not need the 10-character course code, but you will need the 20-character code that comes with your textbook. Your homework access code card comes wrapped inside your book, so be sure not to throw it away. Homework due dates are posted in ALEKS on the first day of class. Completing your homework in a timely manner is essential to success in this course. You have access to all the due dates for all the assignments on the first day of class, so work ahead and plan accordingly. You also have access to all the ALEKS homework assignments after the due date for you to review and study from. **Any homework submitted after the due date will earn a zero in the grade book.**

Exams – 3 Unit Exams

Exams are timed and once you begin, you must finish the exam in the same sitting. **There will be no make-up or re-do exams.** All exams are graded fully on correctness, and some questions have multiple parts. **Exams can be found in our Blackboard course site, which will then direct you to access the ALEKS online exams.** You may use your calculator and any handwritten notes on your exam. You may NOT use your cell phone calculator or any other device that can access the internet. Once you complete a question on your ALEKS exam, you may not move backwards. If you'd like to take an exam before it appears in ALEKS, please email me and I will open it early for you. See the Academic Dishonesty section below for our institution's cheating policy. *All work must be completed by you and you only.* Procrastination is not your friend when completing exams, so work ahead. Be sure to read the Blackboard announcement regarding partial credit on your exams.

Final Exam

Your final exam will be cumulative. The final exam policies are the same as the unit exams, and the final exam will be taken online in ALEKS. There is not review sheet, so study the entire course. If you fail to complete the final exam prior to the due date, you will receive a failing grade for the course. At the end of the course, your final grade is your grade. I do not change grades for any reason, including but not limited to athletic eligibility, graduation requirements, etc. Put in hard work and diligence throughout the semester and do not ask me to change your final grade.

Extra Credit

There will be no extra credit, so please do not ask for it. Here are some suggestions for work you can put in throughout the semester: sign up for etutoring at the beginning of the semester on the Edison State Library website for free tutoring, ask when you have questions on the material, turn in your assignments completed, spend a minimum of 12-16 hours outside of class time working on the coursework (book assignments, asking questions, homework, and studying), do not skip any assignments, take detailed notes that will make sense to you when you study, make flash cards to help you remember tough topics/formulas/definitions and study them often, practice questions in ALEKS that you missed the first time and rework them until you understand, check your email and your Blackboard course every day. If you need more ideas, please ask. Starting your assignments on the day they are due means you are already behind. Procrastination is not your friend.

Writing Policy

Due to the nature of this course, it is crucial that your mathematical explanations are written clearly and concisely. Your written work will be graded not only on its content, but also on your use of language. Organization, clarity, grammar, spelling, and punctuation will be considered when grading.
