Course Description

An introduction to AI concepts and current top AI tools, with emphasis on applying AI thoughtfully, responsibly and ethically. Students will understand both the importance and power of AI, as well as its limitations and the importance of continuous learning in the ever-changing AI landscape. Academic integrity will be discussed and enforced as students learn current AI tools.
