What's PSY 121 All About?

PSY 121 is an introduction to the scientific study of behavior and mental processes, with an emphasis on neuroscience and behavior (focusing on the brain and nervous system), sensation and perception, learning and memory, thinking, lifespan development (especially childhood), personality, social psychology, emotions, stress, and mental disorders.

Type of Class: This is an online class. Based on the calculations in the Student Catalog, students must plan 9 hours per week towards this class. See more about this in the Catalog.

You should be able to complete course work with PowerPoint. Amazon also has copies of the book if the school does not.

Assignments must be submitted as a Word document and Google documents can be saved as Word documents. The links to documents will NOT BE ACCEPTED. Please do not submit links to Google documents in the Blackboard assignment box. I cannot open them. PLEASE do NOT send me a google doc link or any sort of link. Copy and paste your assignment in the submission box in blackboard- DO NOT PASTE THE GOOGLE DOC LINK THERE, it will not open. This will result in a zero for the assignment. Also do not email me assignments, again this will result in a zero for that assignment.

You also may type your assignment in the submission box in blackboard.

IF YOU DO NOT KNOW HOW TO DO THIS REACH OUT NOW. DO NOT WAIT till the end of the semester and then tell me you do not know how to submit assignments.

What's On Blackboard?

All needed materials (besides the textbook) are on Blackboard. This is an online course, if you do not understand how to use Blackboard or how to submit assignments, PLEASE let me know as soon as possible. I am available every day of the week via the phone, text or email. Normal business hours 8am-8pm. Be sure to pay attention to all dates listed in the syllabus start, midterm and end dates.

Most materials are arranged by Chapter and will be posted weekly include:

- The chapter PowerPoint presentations
- The drop box to submit the Unit Assignment electronically
- Updates and announcements

All-important course information is posted on Blackboard, so check it frequently. You will submit your assignments through blackboard. Emailed assignments will not be accepted. If you do not know how to submit through blackboard do not wait till mid semester to reach out.

Attendance will be recorded daily in case an advisor or administrator inquiries about you. I will check to see that you are logging in at least once a week to go over assignments and readings.

I will excuse a student's absence if he/she can provide some kind of written verification (doctor's note, court summons, work time sheet, etc.) for the absence. Vacations are not considered to be excused absences.

Students who miss class for three (3) consecutive weeks without contacting the instructor may be subject to a Faculty Initiated Withdrawal. This procedure gives Edison faculty the right to withdraw non-attending students from a course.

How Will I Be Graded?

Essay questions will be posted weekly for each Chapter worth 35 points each. Expect a question for each chapter, as this is a online only class.

Discussion questions will be worth 20pts, if I add one to the chapter.

The final will be worth 80 points, which is a large part of your grade.

Tests and quizzes will be pointed and scored as needed. If I feel you are all not getting a good grasp on the topic, I will quiz or test. I will provide enough time to study, and I will post in advance the date of the quiz. I will not pop quiz you.

Purpose:

- To ensure the student recognizes, recalls, and understands the major course concepts

Chapter Assignments:

Purpose:

- To determine if the student understands the topic well enough to explain and describe it to others.
- To help the student apply course concepts to his/her own life and experiences
- To encourage the student to review the material just learned
- To allow the student to benefit from the knowledge of others and help instruct others

Working ahead: As you will see, I do not always post assignments ahead of time on blackboard. I do this not to punish anyone, but rather I want you to absorb as much as the chapter/unit as possible and have the opportunity to ask questions when the pop up. However, I have been a college student as well, and I understand some of you have jobs,

families and unexpected events. If you need to work ahead a few chapters PLEASE EMAIL, text or call me. I will work something out with you. I am very flexible and understanding so do not feel intimidated to reach out. I want you all to have success in this class.

What Should I Do To Pass PSY 121?

"Even when you don't feel certain of your abilities, it's important to put on an attitude of discipline and assurance, because more often than not, your attitude will be the very thing that will help you achieve your academic goals no matter what they are."

The above quote came from a student assignment, and since I can't possibly improve on her wording, I decided to include it here. Too many students come to college believing that academic success has to do with intelligence or a natural ability to learn. But the reality is

much simpler! Based on my years of instructing, here is my simple, five-step strategy for academic success: Come to class, Pay attention and take notes, Study, Submit all required work, Follow instructions!

Week 1-14 We will read each chapter or view PowerPoint, and essay a essay question for the previous chapter. For instance, on week one you will read chapter one, on week 2 you will read chapter 2 and answer the essay question for chapter on, and so on. Follow directions on Blackboard as assignments might be subject to change. I have put everything in modules so it will be easy to find and complete.

Final: You will have a final assignment due, it will be a 2-3 full paged paper with citations if applicable. I will post this around week 11-12 to allow you to get enough information to complete it before the final grading period ends .
