Your *three* lowest homework grades will be automatically dropped at the end of the semester. No exam grades will be dropped. There will be no make-up exams. You have access to all the due dates for all the assignments on the first day of class, so plan accordingly. Procrastination is not your friend when working on assignments, so please work ahead. Technology issues at the last minute are detrimental to your success, so please work ahead. **Due dates for tests or XYZ assignments will not be extended due to technical problems.**

Homework in XYZ MATH

No late homework will be accepted for any reason, even a good one. Remember that your *three* lowest homework grades will be dropped so missing a few assignments will not destroy your grade. Online homework assignments have unlimited attempts until the due date and will be delivered online via XYZ online homework system. A tutorial on how to create your homework account is located in the *XYZ MATH* section in Blackboard.

Homework and test due dates are posted on the first day of class. Completing your homework in a timely manner is essential to success in this course. Use the resources provided for you in XYZ Math to help you. You can also email me or utilize Edison State's free in person or eTutoring if you have questions. For technology issues with XYZ MATH, contact their Customer Support, they are excellent and respond quickly. Procrastination is not your friend when completing homework, so please work ahead.

Important Note about XYZ MATH: Any work completed after the due date is not counted toward your grade, but please go back and review your past homework assignments to help you study for exams.

Labs – There are four lab assignments and they count as homework. If you use a MAC you must convert your completed lab to a work doc or pdf. A Google doc does not submit well in Bb and I recommend using word. You can download the lab and type in your answer and submit it back to Bb. If you write in your answers you must submit a scanned document or a picture. You can email me ahead of time and I will check to see if your lab submitted correctly, however that only applies if you submit your lab before the weekend. I cannot guarantee I will see your request over the weekend. If your lab does not submit correctly, you will get a zero on the lab. I will not accept it late via email.

Contacting XYZ MATH Customer Support

If you run into technological issues with homework, you must contact XYZ Math support. Waiting until the last minute for your assignments does not allow time to work out these issues, so please work ahead on your assignments.

eTutoring

Exams and Final Exam

You must access all exams using repondus lockdown browser. You will need a working webcam and microphone. It is possible you will run into technological issues when downloading the lockdown browser. Waiting until the last minute does not allow for time to work these issues out before the due date. Do not wait until the last minute to download the browser and take the exam! Technical issues do not warrant an extended due date. If you wait until the last minute and have trouble with the lockdown browser or any other technical issue you will not be allowed to take the test late. This includes thunderstorms which knock out power. You will be required to prepare for and take all exams on or before their scheduled dates and within the allotted time (75 minutes). You will be allowed one (1) attempt for each exam. Once you begin, you must finish the exam. You cannot stop and start again later. **There will be no make-up or re-do exams.**

There is a practice test posted in the "Start Here" folder that gives you a chance to be sure your computer is set and the lockdown browser is set up correctly. I encourage you to take this test in the first week of class so there is time to work through any issues that may arise.
