PACE OF ONLINE ACTIVITIES

Please note: Proper spelling, grammar and punctuation will be expected, and will be part of your grade. The instructor reserves the right to reject any written assignment with five or more mechanical errors.

Do Not expect extra credit.

TESTS

There will be weekly tests.

EXAMS

Students will have 3 exams worth 80-100 points each. The third exam will include an oral assessment.

Final Exam-Oral

The oral final exam worth 50-60 points will consist of an interview, a situation or a short presentation. Students' assessment will use a rubric focusing on the pronunciation, comprehension, vocabulary, fluency, and grammar.

Final Exam-Written

The written final exam worth 80-100 points, although comprehensive due to the nature of the course, will focus on weeks 12-16.
