Class Policy Statements:

Assignments & Evaluation Methods:

1. Chapter(s) to be covered for the week should be read before class and before completing the related assignments/test; Refer to the **weekly class schedule** (attached) to prepare yourself for each week of the course
2. Assignments will be completed on Blackboard for up to 300 points, which is **24%** of your overall grade:
 - a. Fourteen (14) weekly Vocab assignments via Blackboard worth 10 points each
 - b. Fourteen (14) weekly 5-Question assignments available on Blackboard worth 10 points each
 - c. One (1) end-of-term write-up via Discussion Board (week 16) worth 20 points
3. Fourteen (14) end-of-chapter exams (on Blackboard) are worth 50 points each for a total of **56%** of your final grade; Individual tests consist of 25 multiple-choice questions with each question being worth 2 possible points
4. One (1) project submitted on Blackboard worth 250 points for a total of **20%** of your final grade
5. Extra credit is available as weekly discussion board entries at up to 10 points each (up to 80 total points)
