Description

American Sign Language (ASL) 121 is a beginning course designed to provide a foundation for non-signers wishing to study ASL and learn about Deaf Culture. It includes techniques for communicating with Deaf individuals using the manual alphabet, numbers, and sign vocabulary. An overview of syntax, grammar, and culture is provided. This course is not designed to train the student to function as an interpreter for the Deaf.

Required Materials

Learning Objectives

- Appropriately use ASL grammatical features including questions, statements, and spatial agreement
- Recognize the Deaf community as a distinct, cultural entity within American Culture
- Develop basic vocabulary, fingerspelling, and numbering skills with conversational proficiency.

Teaching Strategies

This class will be fully remote/online. Every unit/chapter will have lecture videos done by the professor and/or through the use of video media. **Lecture videos done by myself will not have captions, but will have the powerpoint in the background to understand what I am signing.** Every unit/chapter in your required text, will have instruction videos as well. Students will have the freedom to choose which teaching strategy suits their needs for the course. **Students will be responsible for any supplemental/additional vocabulary that the professor provides.**

Due to the nature of the class being fully remote/online, all communication will be done via email or through announcements through Blackboard. Assignments

Written Assignments:

All written assignments must be prepared in a professional manner and not use AI. The assignment grade will reflect the student's use of Standard English practice. "Professional" is defined by the guidelines stated in the Publication Manual of the American Psychological Association 5th ed. Refer to the Writing and Speaking Rubric. This includes: spelling and punctuation, capitalization, sentence and paragraph structure, grammar, clarity of expression and organization. Be sure you have proofread all of your papers.

Deaf Awareness Assignment:

You will pick one Deaf, Hard of Hearing, Late Deaf, or DeafBlind individual to make a Powerpoint or Google Slides about their life and how they have benefited the Deaf/HoH community, DeafBlind Community, and/or the Disabled community. You should have a minimum of five slides for this project.

Deaf Culture Movie Review:

You will watch the Oscar Winning Short Film, The Silent Child. After watching the film, you write a two page paper detailing and answering the following: discuss the plot, discuss how Libby changed during the movie and why, discuss what you learned from the movie, and what you believe is the reason or moral of the short film.

Student Videos:

After every Unit/Chapter, you will be required to submit a recorded video of yourself to demonstrate your proper signing skills, vocabulary, and expressions. Learning ASL involves not only receptive skills (watching someone sign), but also expressive skills.

Below are the following guidelines for recording your videos:

- You may record anywhere in your home, school, coffee shop, and/or any location
- Videos are always kept private and will only be seen by the professor for grading purposes
- Background noise will not interfere with grading
- Please have good lighting. If you are in a dark area, I can't see your hands and face, which will make grading very difficult
- If you are having a hard time uploading your video to Blackboard, you are welcome to upload and send a link from a third party platform such as: Youtube, We Transfer, Dropbox, and etc.

If you are concerned about submitting videos of yourself for any reason, you MUST contact the instructor immediately to make arrangements for an alternative assignment. Alternative assignments are only available with proof of extenuating circumstances.

Unit/Chapter Tests:

After every Unit/Chapter, you will have a test. Each test will be cumulative. The test will

consist of watching a video and answering questions related to the video and/or writing what is being signed to you.

Assignments and Project Standards:

Unit/Chapter assignments will be due every two weeks. Unit/Chapter assignments will be done through the online required textbook.

Assignments not turned in on the designated date will receive a reduction of 30 points per day. Assignments that are four days past the due date will not be accepted and will result in a zero.

If a student is having difficulty with the online textbook and/or the online assignment, the student will need to email the professor as soon as possible.

Extra credit will not be given in this class. There are no assignments to bring a failing grade to a passing grade nor assignments to bring a grade the student's desire.

Testing Policies:

Tests and/or assessments are to be completed on time. If tests and/or assessments are not completed on time it will result in a zero. Cheating will not be tolerated nor accepted. If the professor suspects the student(s), the student(s) will be given a zero on the test as well as potentially zero in the class.

The Student Handbook <https://www.edisonohio.edu/digipub/StudentHandbook/index.html>, pages 28-29 clearly defines academic dishonesty and how Edison handles cases of academic dishonesty. Any use of AI (outside of spell-checker) must be approved by the instructor and noted with the following at the bottom of the assignment: Any final draft exhibiting the use of AI without permission and crediting the source will be counted as plagiarism. Any assignment that is plagiarized (whether intentional or unintentional) or lacks appropriate citations will automatically

receive a failing grade. Intentional submission of someone else's work as your own will result in automatic failure for the course. Whereas, assignments that simply fail to cite in MLA format will have points deducted accordingly.
