COURSE DESCRIPTION

Focuses on the knowledge, skills, and attitudes needed to safely practice evidence-based patient-centered nursing. Competency areas include: leadership and management; the integration of learned concepts and skills in the care of groups of clients; and a focus on child-bearing families. Emphasis is on helping the capstone student integrate and apply the knowledge, skills, and attitudes necessary to make sound clinical judgments and improve the quality and safety of the health care systems within which they work. Clinical opportunities include a 96-hour Internship with a preceptor in a hospital setting, and a variety of community placements that focus on children and expectant mothers. Prerequisite: NUR 265S with a grade of 'C' or better. Lab fee.

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Course Outline

This course is divided into four units:

Unit 1: Maternal, Newborn, and Women's Health

Women's health, maternity, and newborn nursing are specialty areas within the nursing profession. The purpose of an associate degree nursing program is to prepare a generalist nurse who can provide safe, evidence-based care across a variety of healthcare settings. Therefore, this unit focuses on the foundational knowledge and skills that every nurse should be expected to demonstrate during the first year of professional practice. Nurses who choose to specialize in women's health or maternal-newborn nursing will receive additional education, training, and orientation through their employing healthcare organization. With the goal of preparing a competent generalist nurse in mind, this unit of study will focus on six key aspects of women's health, maternity, and newborn nursing. The concepts included in this unit are:

1. Overview of Maternal, Newborn, and Women's Health Care
2. Reproductive and Women's Health
3. Pregnancy and Fetal Development
4. Labor and Birth
5. Following Birth
6. Newborn Care

Unit 2: Leadership, Management, and Community Health Nursing

This unit introduces the foundational concepts of leadership, management, and community health nursing. It builds on knowledge gained in previous nursing courses while introducing additional concepts that a generalist nurse needs to provide safe, high-quality, and cost-effective patient care across a variety of healthcare settings. The concepts included in this unit are:

1. Leading and Managing Client Care
2. Coordinating Client Care
3. Professional Responsibilities
4. Maintaining a Safe Environment
5. Culture of Safety in Delivering Care
6. Foundations of Community and Public Nursing
7. Drivers of Health
8. Using Evidence

10. Individual and Family Well-Being
11. Populations at Risk for Disruptions in Well-Being

Unit 3: Pediatric Nursing

Pediatric nursing is a specialty area within the nursing profession. The purpose of an associate degree nursing program is to prepare a generalist nurse who can provide safe, effective care across a variety of healthcare settings. As a result, this unit focuses on the foundational pediatric knowledge and skills that every nurse should be expected to demonstrate during the first year of professional practice. Nurses who choose to specialize in pediatric nursing will receive additional education, training, and orientation through their employing healthcare organization. This approach ensures that students develop the essential pediatric competencies needed for entry-level nursing practice while recognizing the specialized preparation required for pediatric nursing roles. The concepts included in this unit are:

1. Overview of Pediatric Nursing Pediatric Nursing Today
2. Caring for Pediatric Clients Across the Lifespan
3. Specific Consideration in the Pediatric Population
4. Health Alterations in the Pediatric Population

Unit 4: Pharmacology/NCLEX Success

This unit of study will be divided into two sections. The first section is a comprehensive review of pharmacology in addition to a focused review of the drug classifications that are assigned to Nursing 275, which includes: respiratory, anti-infective, reproduction

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and vaccines. Students must demonstrate knowledge of administration and monitoring of medications used for conditions that are discussed throughout the semester.

The second section of this unit of study is designed to enhance the student's probability of NCLEX success by identifying individual topics needing further review to maximize the NCLEX Review Course experience.

The concepts presented in each unit are not meant to be all-inclusive. If you are able to discuss and answer questions related to these concepts, you will have a comprehensive understanding of the material and be able to critically think through and apply concepts to clinical situations.

Adverse Weather Conditions

In the event, the college is closed:

1. For students attending OB clinical, each clinical faculty member will make a determination regarding cancellation due to weather. Individual clinical faculty will notify students of clinical cancellation, delays, or early dismissal.

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2. Students scheduled at other community clinical sites will contact the sites to determine if they are open. If they are open and it is deemed by the student to be safe to travel, the student will attend as scheduled. Faculty will reschedule the experience if unable to attend.
3. Students scheduled for practicum experience may attend if the student deems it is safe to travel.
4. If the college is on a delay, you are to report to class if the opening time is before 12 noon.

Methods of Teaching

The course consists of a series of activities and assessments to assist the student in achieving the outcomes/objectives for the course. Students will engage in self-study methods including reading and online assignments. In-class activities are used to increase the students' ability to develop the knowledge, skills, and attitude needed to provide safe nursing care. Self-directed learning is required to complete readings and identify needs for further information or review.

Strategies that may be used include: lecture, discussion, demonstration, media resources (YouTube and others), role-playing, simulation, team-based learning strategies, audio-visual aids, computer assisted instruction, study and practice groups, and case studies. Students interact with their fellow classmates and faculty for shared learning.

Throughout the semester, various combinations of activities are used to prepare students for testing, which include:

- Weekly Student Learning Outcomes (WSLO)
- Reading from the textbook and other resources
- Adaptive quizzing
- Dosage calculations
- Case studies
- Videos or other media resources
- Instructor assistance during office hours, by appointment, by e-mail, or by phone communication

Methods of teaching/learning include use of web enhancement through Blackboard, class presentation by the instructor, and frequent small group activities where students are encouraged to seek information, review concepts, theories and research, cluster data, review their own opinion and previously held assumptions, and make judgments required for sound decision-making as a registered nurse.

Learning is enhanced through a collaborative process built on trust, shared responsibility, and active participation by both students and faculty. An experiential, inquiry-based approach encourages students to engage openly in the learning process while drawing on the diverse knowledge, skills, and experiences of their peers and instructors.

Faculty serve as facilitators and co-learners, guiding student-centered learning experiences that promote critical thinking, problem-solving, and personal accountability for learning. Community service-learning experiences are integrated into clinical practice through partnerships with healthcare and community organizations. These experiences are designed to benefit both the individuals or communities being served and the students providing the service.

Service-learning encourages students to apply classroom concepts in real-world settings and to work with diverse populations and cultures. Through these experiences, students strengthen their professional knowledge, develop cultural awareness, and gain a deeper understanding of community health needs.

Features of service-learning include:

1. Apply knowledge by testing and applying academic learning.
2. Synthesize knowledge by bringing together past and present learning, giving coherence to students' studies.
3. Critically think and analyze by learning to distinguish what is and is not important in the unfiltered context of the real world.
4. Learn about cultural diversity by learning with, from, and about people of other races, ages, economic means, and competencies.
5. Develop values through firsthand interaction with community issues.
6. Learn inductive reasoning by using the specific as an embarkation point for hypothesizing and theorizing.

Exercises are designed to strengthen listening skills, and role-playing activities may be used to enhance students' ability to apply therapeutic communication techniques and nursing therapeutics, including physiologic care, anticipatory guidance, health teaching, counseling, and health system management. Students are expected to engage in self-directed learning by completing assigned readings and identifying areas that require additional study or review.

Additional academic support resources are available through the Student Development Office. Services such as stress management programs, test anxiety workshops, and other learning support opportunities are offered to help students achieve academic success.

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Personal issues may arise when topic areas, such as suicide, abuse, alcoholism, post-traumatic stress, etc., are initiated in class. All students are encouraged to inform the instructor know if they feel a need for referral. If the student wishes, the student may directly contact other Edison State Community College resources.

The instructors are available to help with individual learning needs or concerns.

Clinical Preparation and Professional Behavior

NUR 275 nursing students are soon-to-be licensed health care professionals; therefore, it is expected that the students will be active and assertive learners. By taking an active part in the clinical learning experience, the student will maximize his/her own personal learning experience. For each clinical experience, the student is required to:

- Wear the appropriate Edison State Community College nursing uniform and identification in all settings.
- Be on time and be prepared for the clinical experience.
- Take an active role in learning and participating in assigned experiences for the day.
- Maintain a high level of involvement in the activities of the unit where appropriate.

Clinical with At-Risk Populations

If an illness/emergency prevents your prompt attendance at a scheduled clinical experience, you must call your preceptor and notify faculty by email or phone prior to your scheduled start time. Faculty will reschedule or make alternate assignments.

Practicum

If an illness/emergency prevents your prompt attendance at a contracted practicum experience, you must model the role of an employee: contact your preceptor prior to your scheduled start time and notify faculty of the change in your schedule via email or phone.

Classroom/Clinical/Practicum Policy:

No recording devices of any kind including laptops, I-Pads, tablets, e-readers, smart phones, smart watches, cameras, video/audio recorders may be used in the classroom, testing, clinical, or practicum environment.

Laptops may be used in class and for testing only. No recording is allowed.

Cell phones, if allowed in the clinical/practicum area, must be placed in silent mode and used for emergency notification only.

Cell phones must be placed in silent mode and used for emergency notification only when in the classroom.

No hats or hoodies will be allowed during class or testing.

Children are not permitted in the classroom, lab, or clinical/practicum.

Syllabus Changes

Changes in assignments, order of lecture or lab presentation, test dates, clinical requirements and other course related changes occur by decision of the faculty. Students are notified as soon as possible via email and Blackboard announcements.

Clinical Skills

The student is responsible for competence in all skills taught in past semesters. Any student needing skill remediation must notify faculty immediately.

Health Status

The student is responsible to report any changes in health status that limits their ability to meet the health requirements as outlined on the physical form. Students who attend clinical/practicum experiences and are not current in their health requirements will receive a critical element for putting patients at risk.

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An Overview of Course Arrangement and Structure

Progression is required of students as they move through the evidence-based nursing curriculum at Edison State Community College. Students are preparing to move from a student environment to an independent work environment. The Nursing 275-S Flex capstone course is designed to assist students in meeting the requirement of progression as they: integrate increasingly complex knowledge and skills; continue to develop the clinical judgment necessary to provide safe care and reduce risk potential for patients. Students must become more autonomous and self-directed, taking on increasingly independent responsibilities while displaying appropriate accountability behaviors and maintenance of professional boundaries to meet course and clinical outcomes for Nursing 275-S Flex.

Student success depends, in part, on:

- Accountability
- Keeping faculty advised when students are in a clinical area (see Notification Protocol for Clinical and Practicum.)
- Time management
- Scheduling, completing assignments in a timely manner, and communicating effectively with faculty are critical activities. Students, under the direction of faculty and within specific parameters, do clinical self-scheduling (see Notification Protocol for Clinical and Practicum.)
- A portion of class time is planned for independent learning by students and for completing assigned work. Some of the course assignments are self-arranged by students. Students are responsible for efficient use of time throughout the semester and for completing all work assigned in order to successfully complete the course.

This course is presented in the FLEX format. The class meets on campus for 10 of the 16 weeks of the semester. Alternative methods of presentation and assignments have been developed to enhance the learning experience for the weeks the student does not meet on campus. For the weeks we do not meet on campus, it is imperative that students independently schedule time to complete readings and activities as outlined in the syllabus.

All testing and assignments are designed to explore and reinforce:

- Quality and Safety Education in Nursing (QSEN) competencies
- Course outcomes

Faculty uses the most valid, reliable test methods, and the most accurate test analysis methods available. The faculty's main goal is student success, and all students are treated equally.

All submissions must be accurate, complete, and submitted by the date specified. Submissions must be submitted through Blackboard using the form supplied in the assignment link unless otherwise specified. Assignments that do not meet college standards will be returned without a grade. Students are required to correct the assignment and resubmit it by date noted. One resubmission per assignment is allowed.

Supporting documentation used for assignments must be evidence-based. Proper citation and discussion of strength of evidence measures must be included. Strength of evidence measures (meta-analysis, etc.) may be found at <http://qsen.org/competencydomains/evidence-based-practice/>.

96-Hour Practicum

- The student must schedule and complete 96 hours of clinical time over six weeks with the assigned preceptor during the module assigned. (**Module A: 1/31/2026 – 3/14/2026, Module B: 3/21/2026 – 5/9/2026**)
 - Priorities for scheduling clinical time with a Preceptor:
 - a. the Preceptor's judgment about when the best learning experiences are available
 - b. the Preceptor's work schedule

- After a short orientation to the surroundings, the student is expected to take an active role in meeting the clinical outcomes of Nursing 275-S. The practicum is not an observational experience.
- The student is to demonstrate responsibility and accountability for scheduling hours and completion of this assignment. This is a learning contract with the facility and should only be altered by the preceptor or in case of illness/emergency. All missed time **MUST** be rescheduled so the student is instructed to schedule 2 make-up dates with the preceptor at the beginning of the experience to allow for possible unforeseen changes.
- If you arrive at your practicum site and your preceptor is not available (sick, cancelled, vacation, etc.) **YOU CANNOT STAY AND BE ASSIGNED TO ANOTHER PRECEPTOR FOR THAT DAY. YOU MUST LEAVE AND USE A SCHEDULED MAKE-UP DATE.**
- If you stay over on your shift to finish charting, the additional time does not count in your 96-hours.
- This is a participative experience. The student will progressively take more responsibility in providing care for a group of patients as defined by the practice setting. Prior to going to the first clinical experience, the student must review all previous program skills to be able to provide safe care. At the first clinical experience the student is responsible for identifying how to access and use policies and procedures specific to the clinical setting.
- The student will wear school uniform and name tag at the clinical site. If the preceptor indicates specific unit dress requirements, (scrubs) then the student will wear uniform to the site and then change.
- Personal dress and appearance must be in compliance with the Nursing Student Handbook.
- The student is responsible for acting in a professional manner and uses effective communication skills when dealing with any issues that may arise with the preceptor. Students are responsible for conferring with faculty if issues cannot be resolved.
- The student is responsible for notifying the faculty of any unexpected event/occurrence.
- The student will have one opportunity to successfully complete a practicum. If the student's performance is unsatisfactory a grade of "D" will be recorded and result in failure of the course. Determination of successful completion will be the responsibility of the faculty with input from the preceptor and the site coordinator.
- The student is responsible for obtaining the Preceptor Qualification Form prior to completing their first practicum experience. Hours do not count unless the form has been completed.

NOTE: The Practicum assignment models a work setting, with the student participating in the role of a nurse. Practicum time may be scheduled on weekends, holidays and when the college is closed. Faculty is available 24X7 (see Notification Protocol). Each student makes his or her individual decision about illness and/or safe travel during inclement weather, just as an employee would do.
