President's Report to the Edison State Community College Board of Trustees September 18, 2025

> President's Office

- On September 5, The President's Council held its annual retreat at Lost Creek Reserve. The focus of the retreat was development of the 2026-2029 Strategic Plan. After presentations from Kim Zornes, Dr. Rick Hanes, and Dr. Jeannette Passmore, the Council members separated into small groups and spent most of the afternoon brainstorming potential action items in support of the three strategic priorities that will guide the new Strategic Plan and the Rural Guided Pathways project:
 - The Right Academic Programs Delivered in the Right Format
 - Student Success Model Connecting with Students and Connecting Them with Careers
 - Marketing/Communicating Edison State's Identity
- I sent the following e-mail to all employees on September 4 as an update on Edison State's SB1 (The Advance Ohio Higher Education Act) compliance efforts:

Hello Everyone,

Over the past few months, Edison State has been working hard to implement the requirements of The Advance Ohio Higher Education Act (Senate Bill 1). Many people have been involved in this effort, and I want to thank them for all they have done because it has been challenging work. Today we are announcing the results of our compliance with perhaps the most difficult aspect of SB1, the rule that says academic degree programs of study must average at least 5 graduates over a 3-year period. I am sad to report that the following degree programs have fallen below this 5-graduate average threshold and will thus be eliminated from our curriculum:

- Agricultural Maintenance
- Aviation: Professional Pilot
- Banking
- Early Childhood Education
- Equipment Maintenance: HVAC
- Industrial Equipment Supervision
- IMT Industrial Operations
- IMT Operations Technology
- Interactive Media Web Design

- Interactive Media Web Development
- Paralegal Studies
- Veterinary Technology

While these closures mean that Edison State will no longer admit students into the affected programs, effective immediately, we remain committed to helping all students currently enrolled in these programs to finish their degrees. Consequently, each program will develop a "teach out plan" to meet students' needs. The teach out plans may run for 1 to 3 years from now, depending on enrollment numbers, courses needed, etc. Some of the programs listed above are led by faculty who also oversee viable programs with more than 5 graduates; these faculty positions will not be affected. For other programs on the list, the full-time faculty lead will remain with the College through this academic year and possibly longer, depending on the specific teach out plan. Adjunct faculty needs will be evaluated as the teach out plans become clear. Students are being informed now of these closures, and changes to our external-facing publications are in the works.

This "unduplicated headcount" is up by 1% over last year. Total credit hours for the Fall 2025 semester were down slightly compared to last year, with a drop of 1%.
