OUR CAREER Pathways

Our career pathways offer a clear route to help you achieve your goals. Once you select a career pathway and enroll in classes, you will work toward earning industry-recognized short-term technical certificates, certificates, technical degrees, or transferable associate degrees. These credentials will set you on the path to success, regardless of your destination.



Bachelor's Degree

(122 Credits)

Edison State offers a bachelor's degree in the health sciences pathway that positions you for success in a supervisory role.



Associate Degree

(60-65 Credits)

Associate degrees are available in various career pathways. Our associate degrees will prepare you for the workforce or to further your education at a four-year college.



Certificate

(30-37 Credits)

Numerous certificates are available within each career pathway. Earning a certificate allows you to enter the workforce and build toward an associate degree using the same credits. You can earn a certificate in as little as 12 months.



Short-Term Technical Certificate

(<30 Credits)

Gain skills to start a new job or advance in your current career with short-term technical certificates, which consist of up to seven courses that can be completed in a year or less.

University Transfer

IDENTIFY *Existing Credit*

You may already have college credits waiting to be claimed. Many students discover they can earn credit for coursework through work experience, military training, professional certifications, or previous education. Our Career Pathways Advisors and Enrollment Managers will help you turn your real-world knowledge into official college credit.

AR

Articulated Credit

Formal agreements established between organizations to award college credits.

MTAGs

Military Transfer Assurance Guides

A statewide guarantee that certain types of military training, experience, and/or coursework align with college courses to award appropriate credit.

CTAGs

Career-Tech Assurance Guides

Students who successfully complete select coursework in high school or adult career-tech institutions may be eligible to earn college credit.

PLE

Prior Learning Experience

Find out if the knowledge you've gained previously outside the classroom will qualify for credit through a Prior Learning Assessment or C-PLeX.

CCP

College Credit Plus

Earn college and high school credit concurrently, accelerating your college career at little to no cost.

PR

Proficiency Exam

Edison State proctors over 30 proficiency exams that allow you to earn credit by testing out of specific classes.

Graduates are prepared for careers as engineering technicians, CNC operators, CAD drafters, quality assurance specialists, and maintenance technicians, with a clear pathway to advancement as their experience grows.



HEALTH SCIENCES *Pathway*

Our programs prepare you for roles in direct patient care and behind-the-scenes diagnostics—from nursing, physical therapy, and respiratory care to medical lab work and medical assisting. Most health sciences pathway programs prepare you for state certification and credentials needed to launch your career, while the Nursing (RN to BSN) bachelor's degree is designed for licensed nurses ready to advance.

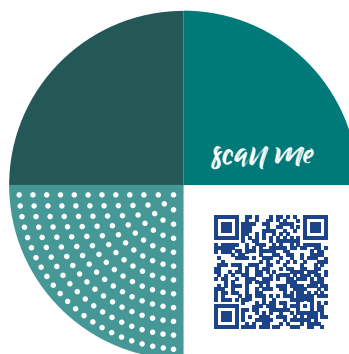

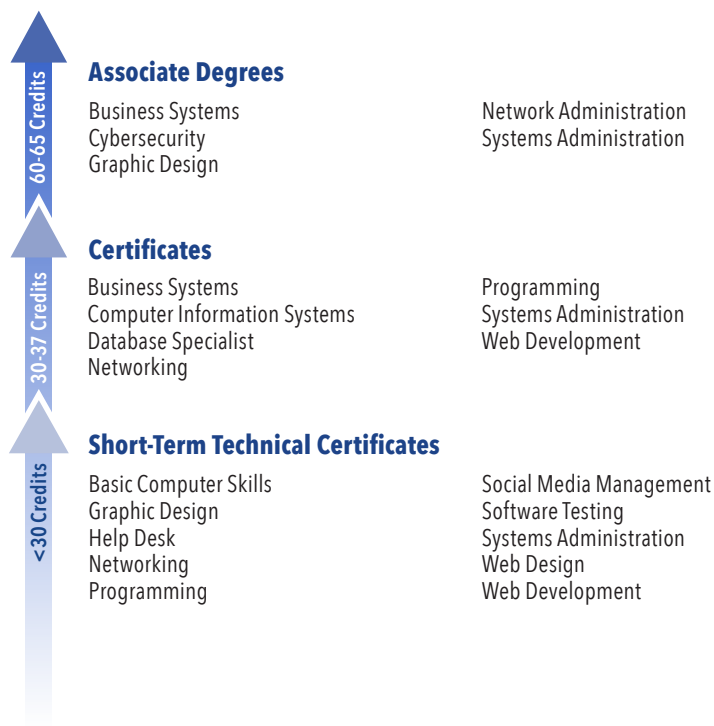

Transfer Agreements

The Ohio Transfer 36 module includes general education courses that all Ohio public colleges accept. The 36 credits in the Edison State transfer module will transfer to any public college in Ohio.

A student who works on campus while going to college.

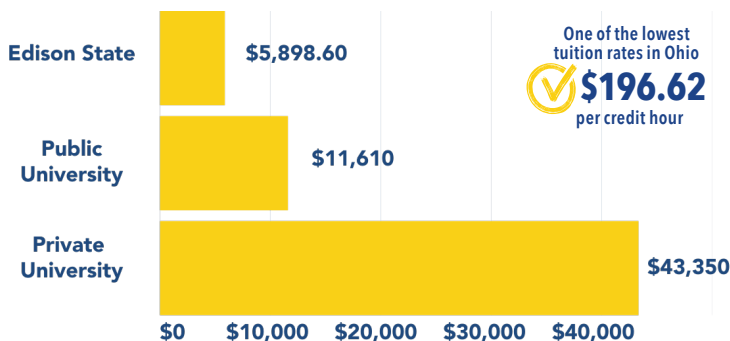

Grants

Student Lounge

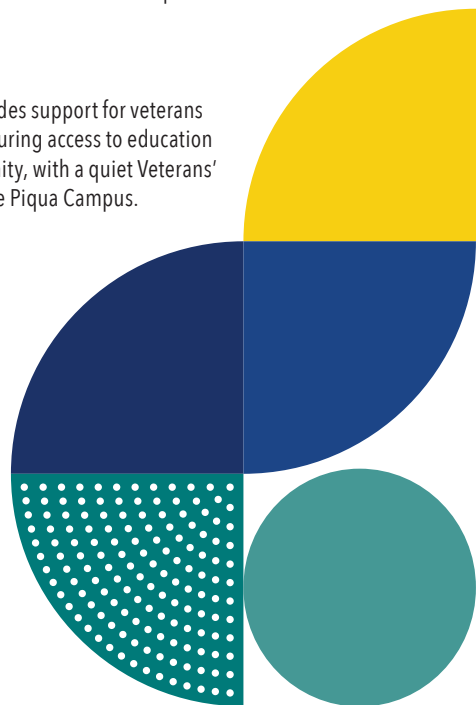
Each campus has a student lounge for relaxing, meeting classmates, or watching TV.
