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Charger Basketball Teams Finish On Top

Both the men's and women's basketball teams set the bar high for the 2019-20 season only to cut a successful season short due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The men finished a winning season with a district tournament appearance. The women's team, who finished 28-3 overall, earning the title of Co-League Champions and District Champions, were slated to continue in the NJCAA Region XII D-II national tournament which was cancelled. While the national tournament results will never be known, the teams have laid the foundation for another successful season in 20-21.

Ohio's TechCred program gives businesses the chance to upskill current or future employees, helping them qualify for a better job in today's tech-infused economy.





Lt. Gov. Husted Visits Edison State to Discuss TechCred

With Edison State as a training partner, employers have access to numerous short-term, technology-focused, and industry-recognized credentials that qualify for funding through Ohio's TechCred program. Employers can be reimbursed by up to \$2,000 per employee, up to \$30,000 total available per funding period, in training costs once the employee has completed a credential.

Edison State currently offers certificates that qualify for the TechCred program in the areas of apprenticeships, business technology, customized training, healthcare technology, information technology, IT and cybersecurity, manufacturing, and robotics/automation.


The Numbers Are In!

According to the Ohio Association of Community College FY20 Trend Analysis Report...

- A Edison State increased course completions by 12.7% from 2015 to 2019.
- **B** From 2015 to 2019, Edison State increased enrollment 9% while the other state community colleges as a whole decreased 9%.
- Edison State increased total success points by 13.8% from 2015 to 2018, meaning over the time period the college's production became more efficient.
- D Edison State has *increased transfer production by 21.9%* from 2015 to 2019, meaning over the time period the college's production became more efficient. Improvements were seen for Access Transfers and Minority Transfer students.



Edison State Students Named to All-Ohio Team

The Ohio Association of Community Colleges has named four Edison State Community College students to the 2020 All-Ohio Academic Team, awarding the honorees over \$2,000 in scholarships.

- Leigh Ann Lochtefeld, of Wapakoneta, was one of ten named First Team and will receive a \$1,000 scholarship. Lochtefeld is pursuing both an Associate of Applied Business degree in Cybersecurity and an Associate of Applied Business degree Networking and Systems Administration. She is on track to graduate in May 2021 and plans to enter the workforce upon completion.
- Matthew Studebaker, of Piqua, will receive a \$500 scholarship. Studebaker is an adult learner at Edison State. After completing an Associate of Science degree at Edison State, he plans to continue his education in Middle Childhood Education at a four-year college in Ohio.
- **Dylan Warren**, of Piqua, will receive a \$500 scholarship. Warren is currently a College Credit Plus senior in high school and is on track to graduate from Edison State in December with an Associate of Applied Business degree in Cybersecurity. Upon graduating, Warren intends to transfer to the University of Cincinnati or George Washington University.
- *Brittany Robbins*, of Quincy, was named Third Team, receiving a scholarship valued at \$250. Robbins is pursuing an Associate of Applied Science degree in Nursing from Edison State and expects to graduate in December 2023. After graduating from Edison State, Robbins intends to transfer to the Ohio State University to complete an undergraduate and graduate degree in nursing. Robbins' goal is to one day be in charge of a neonatal unit so that she can "help ease some of the worry and pain that parents feel when their children are in the NICU."

The rankings for the All-Ohio Academic Team are determined by the scores nominees received in the All-USA Academic Team judging. Winners are selected on the basis of academic performance, demonstration of leadership, and community service involvement.

STABLE Account and Edison State Help People with Disabilities Save and Invest

Edison State Community College has become the first college in America to offer STABLE Accounts as a way for faculty and staff to save and invest their wages for qualified expenses for themselves or a loved one with a disability.

Ohio's national Achieving a Better Life Experience (ABLE) account, known as STABLE Account, exists so that people with disabilities can increase their financial resources without impacting their public benefits, like Medicaid and Supplemental Security Income (SSI). This partnership between Edison State and STABLE Account makes it more accessible.

Ohio Treasurer of State Robert Sprague met with Dr. Larson and campus officials on January 31, to congratulate Edison State for this leading initiative. STABLE Account staff members have also met with Edison State faculty and staff to provide information on this available workplace benefit.

Agriculture Maintenance (Associate of Applied Science)

integrates the agricultural sciences and business with training in industrial maintenance and systems integration. This blended program prepares students to install, repair, program, and maintain the vast array of systems and components used across the industries of agriculture. Basic Mechanical (Short-Term Technical Certificate) provides students with the skills to enter a new job field or advance in their current one. Topics including hydraulics, pneumatics, bearings, gears, belts and pulleys, chains and sprockets, couplings, clutches and brakes are examined. Preventive maintenance, predictive maintenance, lubrication and safe rigging practices are also discussed.



Equipment Service (Certificate) develops technicians with the skills and knowledge to service, repair, and maintain various types of equipment and machinery. Students with interest and aptitude in troubleshooting and problem solving will find a broad range of career possibilities awaiting them. These careers build on a prepared background in basic mechanical and electrical systems, safety, customer service, written and oral communications, and working in teams. Students also get substantial hands-on experiential training on real equipment and develop troubleshooting and preventative maintenance methodologies.

Graphic Design (Associate of Applied Business) utilizes students' abilities to design, create, and edit digital content using various software. This program features a comprehensive study of all graphic design aspects, from editing graphics, creating page layouts, producing videos, and developing animations to designing for the web. Students will develop a portfolio and compile it with work from courses within the program.

Web Design (Associate of Applied Business) applies students' abilities to design, create, and edit content in various formats for the web. Students will learn to design and build websites using multiple approaches from different perspectives to ensure that they understand all aspects of web development. Included are the latest standards of HTML, CSS, and JavaScript, as well as various graphic design concepts and techniques for the web. Students will develop a portfolio and compile it with work from their courses within the program.

Interactive Media (Certificate) serves as a gateway for students that are undecided on which interactive media degree they want to complete: Graphic Design, Web Design, or Web Development. Students completing these core courses can get started in the program and identify which degree option interests them the most.

Graphic Design (Short-Term Technical Certificate) utilizes students' creative abilities to design, create, and edit digital content using various graphic design software, primarily for the web.

Social Media Management (Short-Term Technical Certificate) helps students to develop social media strategies to ensure a positive return on investment for an organization. They will also learn about marketing, branding and selling via social media, as well as how to address customer service and support.

Web Design (Short-Term Technical Certificate) helps students to develop, test and maintain websites from the front-end (client-side) and back-end (server-side) to ensure that they understand all aspects of the web development process while using the latest standards of HTML, CSS and JavaScript.

Web Development (Short-Term Technical Certificate) helps students to develop, test and maintain websites from all aspects of the web development process while using the latest standards of HTML, CSS, and JavaScript.

Paramedic (Certificate) trains and educates allied health professionals whose primary focus is to provide advanced emergency medical care for critical and emergent patients. Paramedic students will gain the complex knowledge and skills necessary to provide patient care and transportation. Paramedics function as part of a comprehensive EMS response, under medical oversight, and perform interventions with the basic and advanced equipment typically found on an ambulance or fire/rescue vehicle.

The academic programs outlined above join other recently added programs offered at Edison State such as **Aviation*** (Associate of Applied Science degree and Certificate); **Veterinary Technology** (Associate of Applied Science degree); and **Emergency Medical Technician** (Short-Term Technical Certificate).
