Holiday Evening at Edison State Raises Over \$70K for Student Scholarships

The Edison Foundation held the 21st annual Holiday Evening at Edison State on Wednesday, November 28, raising over \$70,000 for student scholarships. The evening featured high-energy brass funk band *Lucky Chops* from New York as the headlining entertainment.

Over 320 guests attended the annual gala, where they enjoyed hors d'oeuvres, drinks, the company of others, and great music, all while supporting countless students in the upcoming academic year with scholarships.

While known for their popularity among students, the *Lucky Chops'* performance proved to be a crowd pleaser, complete with original material, covers, mash-ups, and a holiday hit. The band performed the classic holiday hit "Silent Night," a cover of Arianna Grande's "Problem," a mash-up of Lipps Inc.'s "Funky Town" and James Brown's "I Feel Good," along with original hits "Buyo," "Miami," and "Behroozi," to name a few.

The band's trombonist, Josh Holcomb, expressed to the audience the positive impact that scholarships had made on his and other band members' lives while attending school in New York City and thanked them for supporting such a worthy cause.

"It was an honor to present the creativity and musicianship of the *Lucky Chops* to our community of Edison State supporters," said Edison State President, Dr. Doreen Larson.

Proceeds from the evening benefit The Edison Foundation's General Scholarship Fund, which directly assists recent high school graduates and those returning to the classroom to start, change or advance their careers.

Following their performance at the 21st annual Holiday Evening at Edison State Community College, the high-energy brass funk band *Lucky Chops* put on two Music Education Clinics for over 370 area junior high and high school jazz students.

Lucky Chops set the stage for the second-day music education clinics by performing several of their top songs, including their original composition, "Without You," a cover of The Jackson Five's "I Want You Back," and a mash-up of several genres of music.

The band then took students through the process of composing music using improvisation techniques. Over fifty students had the chance to interact one-on-one with band members, performing improvised solos to The White Stripes' "Seven Nation Army."

One student commented, "I went to the performance during the school day with my band and I got to go up and play with [*Lucky Chops*] and honestly, it was such a huge confidence boost. I learned a lot just from the short time I was up there and plan to use all of the information that I learned from them and during camps."




Over 110 Students Recognized at Annual Scholarship Recognition Dinner

Edison State Community College in partnership with The Edison Foundation recognized over 110 students during the annual fall scholarship recognition dinner. The event provides recipients with the opportunity to meet the patrons that made their scholarships available.

Following networking and dinner, Dwayne Thompson, Edison State alumni, and Piqua City Schools Superintendent talked about some of the obstacles he had to overcome as a firstgeneration college student.

"I'm a first-generation college student in my family. No one in my family had gone to college prior to me, I had no blueprint, and I had no real knowledge of how I was going to pay for college at that time. I knew college was important to my goals and I simply did not have the means."



As a lifelong resident of Piqua, Thompson was well-aware of Edison State but initially chose a different route, pursuing education from a four-year university.

Simply put, my positive experience at Edison State, served as a strong foundation to my post-secondary education and was everything that I needed as a first-generation college student. -Dwayne Thompson

"My first college application after high school was actually accepted to another university. But after speaking with a mentor to help me fully understand the transition process from high school to college, it caused me to cancel my placement and seek a job that I thought would provide me with a stable income. I could not stop thinking about college, however, with a goal to become an educator I reached out to a counselor at Edison State for the first time."

"After my first visit, my unsure, reluctant, emerging young

self, left with confidence, hope, and a plan for my future. I realized after that one meeting that I could afford my education and I would personally have to fund it but I could work while I was taking classes here at Edison State."







Thompson credits Edison State for setting him on the path to success. "Simply put, my positive experience at Edison State, served as a strong foundation to my post-secondary education and was everything that I needed as a first-generation college student."

After graduating from Edison State, Thompson went on to receive a Bachelor's Degree in Elementary Education from Ohio University and most recently completed a Master's Degree in Early Childhood Education as well as Superintendent Certification from Wright State University.



"Even when I transferred to Ohio University, I would

continue to enroll in classes at Edison State when I would come back and work over the summer break. This ultimately allowed me to earn my bachelor's degree in just two-and-a-half years, saving me both money and time."

Thompson has since served as a teacher, principal, curriculum director, assistant superintendent and now superintendent over the past 26 years - all in the Piqua City Schools System. He was selected as the Piqua Teacher of the Year in 1999 and was a finalist for State Teacher of the Year in 2000. His wife, Merrianne, is a teacher at Piqua Central Intermediate School where their 6th-grade twin daughters and 5th-grade son also attend as students.

Made possible by The Edison Foundation, Edison State Community College, and local organization sponsorships, recipients honored were awarded a total of nearly \$130,000 in academic and need-based scholarships. Scholarships awarded will aid in students' pursuit of higher education at Edison State Community College.

Edison State Community College has announced a plan to offer their students, alumni, friends, employees, and partners access to affordable prescription medications with savings upwards of 87% off retail. These savings are made possible by the *SlashRx* program and will be offered at no cost. The Edison State Community College pharmacy savings card, *SlashRx* was designed to give cardholders affordable generic and brand medications and also benefit The Edison Foundation to support Edison State and its' students and staff. The card is accepted at over 67,000 participating pharmacies nationwide including all major retail pharmacies, big box stores, grocery stores and most independent



pharmacies and can be used by every member of the family including pets. Everyone is eligible, with no income or age restrictions, and the program can save you money even if you have insurance.

No personal information is collected so anyone can use the same card. The focus is to find ways to negotiate deeper discounts with pharmacies, so all individuals and their pets can afford the medications they need.
