Edison State Community College, in compliance with the Federal Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime Statistics Act of 1998, provides the following campus crime statistics and information for Calendar Year 2017. A comprehensive annual report of crime-related information is compiled, published, and distributed to all students and employees, and to any prospective student and employee upon request.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Access to Campus Facilities

Campus buildings and facilities are accessible to members of the campus community, guests, and visitors during normal hours of operation and during other hours for special events. Normal hours of operation are Monday through Thursday 7:30 a.m. to 10:00 p.m., Friday 7:30 am to 4:00 pm, and Saturday 7:30 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. (when classes are in session). If there are no special events scheduled, campus buildings are closed.

Physical Plant

The Piqua (Main) campus consists of approximately 108 acres and one building located on Looney Road. The Darke County campus is a leased facility in Greenville. Edison State has no campus residences.

POLICIES

Alcohol Policy

The Edison State Community College seeks to provide a climate free of the effects associated with the abuse of alcohol and the use of illegal drugs. Individuals or organizations may be granted permission to serve alcoholic beverages in campus buildings in compliance with Ohio State Liquor Laws. The unauthorized use and/or distribution of alcoholic beverages on College owned or controlled property or at College sponsored events are strictly prohibited. Underage persons consuming alcohol and/or anyone found in violation of the liquor laws shall be subject to arrest, criminal prosecution, and disciplinary action by the College.

Drugs

The unlawful possession, use, or distribution of any drug or controlled substance is prohibited on College owned or controlled property or at College sponsored events. Anyone found in violation of the drug laws shall be subject to arrest, criminal prosecution, and disciplinary action by the College.

The Student Affairs department at Edison State Community College can provide referrals for students struggling with alcohol/drug use. Students can be referred to treatment centers within their community as well as 12-step support groups; pamphlets explaining these local resources are available in the Student Affairs Office. For students requesting information about alcohol/drugs, educational

information about warning signs of abuse and dangers of alcohol/drugs is also available. Student Affairs is located on the main campus in Room 160. Hours are 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Monday through Thursday and 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. on Friday. Student Affairs staff can be contacted at 937.778.8600.

Treatment programs for faculty and staff covered under the College's health plan can be found on Medical Mutual of Ohio's website (www.medmutual.com). Faculty and staff members may also access 24/7 confidential counseling on alcohol/drug abuse as well as anger management, stress, grief and loss, and other personal life concerns by contacting our Employee Assistance Program (EAP) provided by Impact Solutions at 1.800.227.6007.

Firearms/Dangerous Weapons

The possession of firearms, explosive devices, fireworks, dangerous or illegal weapons, or hazardous materials on College owned or controlled property or at College sponsored events is prohibited. A valid license does not authorize the licensee to carry a concealed handgun into any facility on College owned or controlled property. Anyone found in violation of the firearms, deadly weapon, dangerous ordinance, or concealed carry laws shall be subject to arrest, criminal prosecution, and disciplinary action by the College.

Sex Offender Notification

House Bill 180 (21st General Assembly) concerning the registration of sex offenders and community notification of registered sex offenders went into effect July 1, 1997. The law, commonly known as Megan's Law, requires certain sex offenders to register with the Sheriff in the county in which they reside. The Sheriff must notify the College of any such registrations.

The Campus Sex Crime Prevention Act went into effect on October 28, 2002. This federal law provides for tracking of convicted, registered sex offenders enrolled as students at institutions of higher education, or working or volunteering on campus. This act amends the Jacob Wetterling Crimes against Children and Sexually Violent Offender Registration Act. Edison State Community College is notified by mail about individuals registered as sexual predators and individuals registered as habitual sex offenders with community notification. Individuals seeking further information about these laws, or the notifications made to the College in accordance with these laws, should contact the Vice President for Administration & Finance at 937.778.8600. Edison State will, upon written request, disclose to the alleged victim of a crime of violence or a non-forcible sex offense, the report on the results of any disciplinary proceeding conducted by the College against a student who is the alleged perpetrator of such crime or offense.

Rape/Sexual Assault/Dating Violence/Stalking

Victims of rape/sexual assault, dating violence, or stalking are strongly encouraged to report incidents to the Campus Security Department. The College will make accommodations in a victim's academic situation if reasonably possible. Students who have experienced sexual harassment or sexual violence on campus should report incidents to the Title IX Coordinator Linda Peltier, Director of Human

Resources, Darlene Francis, Campus Nurse, or the Human Resources office. All can be reached through the main campus number of 937.778.86004.

Emergency Preparedness/Homeland Security

It is important that visitors, students, guests, and employees feel safe on campus. Emergency Response and Evacuation Procedures

The College's emergency response and evacuation procedures are outlined in the [Emergency Procedures Manual](#). Upon the confirmation of a significant emergency or dangerous situation involving an immediate health or safety threat, students, faculty and staff will issue a timely warning. The campus population will be notified via the College's mass notification system (Rave Alert System), mass e-mails, public address system, and/or in person by assigned Campus Security Officers and Building Maintenance Staff. This notification will occur without delay and shall be worded appropriately depending on the emergency. The President, Vice President for Administration & Finance and Facilities Director will determine when there is a significant emergency and who shall be notified and shall also initiate the notification. Evacuation procedures are reviewed periodically. Campus Security will work closely with the Vice President for Administration & Finance, Facilities Director and Building Maintenance staff. The Vice President for Administration & Finance and the Building Maintenance Staff will stay in contact with the College President and the Marketing Department. Any off-campus communication that is deemed necessary will be determined by the Marketing Department.

EDISON STATE SAFETY AND SECURITY

Safety and Security

Edison State Community College contracts with U.S. Security Associates, Inc. to provide security services to our campus. Edison State security officers have the responsibility to provide building and premises security to all property within the limits of the Edison State facility and property, and to protect the lives and safety of employees, students and guests on the property.

Security officers have the authority to enforce all Edison State rules and policies that have been established for the protection of our stakeholders. They have the authority to ask persons for identification to determine whether individuals have lawful business on campus. Security officers do not possess arrest power. Criminal incidents at the Piqua campus are referred to the Piqua Police Department and incidents at the Darke County campus are referred to the Greenville Police Department. Because Edison State is a state community college, the Ohio State Highway Patrol has primary jurisdiction over both campuses. Edison State security maintains a highly professional working relationship with all agencies. All crime victims and witnesses are strongly encouraged to immediately report the crime to campus security and to the Piqua or Greenville Police Departments. Prompt reporting will assure timely warning notices on-campus and timely disclosure of crime statistics.

Security is provided in numerous ways including foot and vehicle patrol, electronic lock system with lockdown function, security cameras, and mass communication systems of Rave Alerts and Rave Guardian. Campus

Maintenance and Facilities is responsible for preventive safety issues such as maintaining well-lighted walkways and parking lots, snow and ice removal, and annual testing and maintenance of emergency alarm systems, fire extinguishers, and sprinkler systems.

The Student Health Nurse is responsible for annual maintenance and testing of campus AEDs and other health programs. Physical and mental health programs are communicated using posters, email, health seminars and public information kiosks and campus TVs.

BEHAVIORAL SUPPORT SERVICES

Communication, Awareness, Response & Evaluation (CARE) Team

The CARE Team exists to provide a route of communication, assessment, and intervention for behaviors exhibited by members of the College community which if left unaddressed, could impact the teaching-learning environment. This cross-functional team utilizes a threat-assessment tool provided by the National Behavioral Intervention Team Association (NABITA) to help determine appropriate courses of action when confronted with reports of such behaviors.

The mission of the CARE Team is to enhance the physical and emotional safety of students, faculty, staff, and others in order to support the teaching-learning environment. CRIME REPORTING

The Campus Security Department is here to serve the entire Edison State community. However, they cannot do it alone. They need and seek your assistance at all times. Edison State encourages voluntary, confidential crime reporting via the Rave Guardian app for smartphones. Additionally, information divulged during pastoral/professional counseling can be done on a confidential basis. Anyone who is a

victim or witness to a crime is encouraged to report the incident to Campus Security or the local authorities. All reports will be investigated. Campus crime and crime-related problems are communicated to all members of the campus community.

Crime Statistics

A comprehensive annual report of crime-related information is compiled, published, and distributed to all students and employees, and to any prospective student and employee upon request. Crime statistics are obtained from the Edison State Campus Security Department, Piqua Police Department, Miami County Sheriff’s Office, Greenville Police Department and non-police campus officials.
