## SESSION 1 January 16, 2019

### Building a High-Performing Nonprofit Organization

Strong leadership, an engaged board of directors, dedicated staff and volunteers who are personally committed to the vision and mission of the organization are clear indicators of a high-performing, healthy nonprofit organization. Session 1 provides the foundation for "building" this high-performing, healthy, successful nonprofit organization.

## SESSION 2 February 20, 2019

### Planning for Passion and Purpose

Building upon Session 1, Session 2 makes the "Case for Strategic Planning" as essential for nonprofits in order to become high-performing, healthy organizations. Standards must be set for vision, mission, core values, strategic goals, action plans and evaluation. Session 2 provides an outline and tools for building a high-performing, healthy organization through strategic planning.

## SESSION 3 March 20, 2019

### Tools for the High-Performing Organization

Session 3 builds upon the foundation for high-performing, healthy nonprofit organizations by providing practices and strategies for energized boards to check their vital signs by giving themselves a periodic "check-up". Session 3 focuses on tools for organizations and their boards to utilize to complete the self-assessments necessary to thrive today and into the future.

## SESSION 4 April 10, 2019

### The Work of the Board in the Community

Session 4 puts it all together for nonprofit organizations who are committed to becoming high-performing, healthy organizations. Presentations and discussions focus on sources of funding, donor development and stewardship, branding, marketing, community engagement, best practices for using social media, event planning and more.

## SESSION 5 May 22, 2019

### Mosaic of Community Leadership Conference

The annual one-day conference held each May, brings together executive directors, board members, staff and volunteers, including the current Academy participants and alumni, to explore in-depth topics related to nonprofit management and leadership. The conference features morning and afternoon breakout education and work sessions led by nonprofit professionals. Sessions at the conference include topics such as: 1) Grant Application and Management, 2) Nonprofit Financial Considerations, 3) Recruitment and Managing Volunteers, 4) Legal Obligations of Nonprofit Leaders, 5) Grant Funding Information Network, 6) Board Recruitment and Development, 7) Marketing and Public Relations and 8) Leadership Development.
